Revision summary

This guide contains an outline summary of topics to be revised for the end of year examinations.

Subject teachers will provide more detailed revision lists and other resources in lessons and / or on Firefly.

Class 2 Revision Guide for Latin:

Length of examination: 1 hour

Revision topics:

Nouns: nominative, accusative, dative cases for 1st, 2nd, 3rd declensions.

Noun/adjective agreement, relative pronouns.

Verbs: porto, doceo, traho, audio, sum, possum and volo, present, perfect and imperfect tenses; imperatives.

All vocabulary and grammar required is provided in the pupils' revision booklet 'Extras CLC Book II, Stages 13-16.'

EXAMINATION FORMAT

Girls will be asked to:

- Fill in a noun chart; fill in a verb chart; fill in a vocabulary chart, giving the English meanings for words in the revision booklet
- Complete exercises with selection of correct grammatical forms of words/vocabulary
- Translate sentences from Latin into English
- Translate a passage from Latin into English

All the information can be found in the girls' revision booklets.

Class 2 Revision Guide for English

The exam is an hour and a half long. There will be two passages to read: a poem and then a piece of factual writing. You will answer questions on the poem, some on meaning and some on the language. You will then complete a Directed Writing task, where you select information from the factual passage and use it to write a creative piece in an appropriate form, such as a diary, letter or conversation. You will also do a punctuation exercise, using full stops, commas, apostrophes and speech punctuation.

Useful to remember:

- Basic parts of speech (nouns, adjectives etc.)
- How to write about figurative language (similes, metaphors, onomatopoeia, personification, alliteration and the effect they have on the reader.)
- How to do 'Directed Writing' (finding and annotating the information in the text; making numbered bullet points and then writing in an appropriate form.)

Revision:

The exam is based on skills you have been practising throughout the year. It is helpful to have a good vocabulary and to keep reading!

Class 2 Revision Guide for French

There will be four sections: **listening, speaking, reading and writing (including grammar)**. Each will be worth 25%. The listening (3rd June) will be approximately 30 minutes and the reading, writing and grammar one hour. For the oral test (week before half-term) you will prepare questions about yourself which you will be given in advance.

General revision points:

- Town and shopping for food and other items*
- School life and daily routine*
- Travel plans and holidays
- Activities: what do you do, what do you like to do, what can one do?
- Describing activities in the past, including household chores
- Conversations at the café
- Describing a house and what is in it**
- Clothes**

- Grammar:
 - Say there is a lot of something and talk about quantities: *une portion de / il y a beaucoup de* (*dossier-langue page 10 of text book*)
 - Say some: **des chips, du pain** (*page 155 of text book in grammar section*)
 - Say there isn't any more of something: **il n'y a pas de / plus de** (*dossier-langue page 14 & 15 of text book*)
 - Use prepositions with towns (**à**), countries and continents (**au, en, aux**) (*dossier-langue page 24 of text book*)
 - Use of **à** to indicate to, in or at (*page 157 of text book in grammar section*)
 - Use of prepositions to say where something is**
 - Present tense of **acheter, préférer, vendre, choisir, apprendre, comprendre, pouvoir, vouloir** and revise **être** and **avoir, aller and faire** (*refer to Grammar in Action book and pages 160-163 of text book*)
 - Reflexive verbs in the present tense, such as *je me lève, tu te couches, il s'habille, nous nous amusons, vous vous ennuyez, ils s'appellent* (*page 42*)
 - The verb '**mettre**' in the past, present and future**
 - Future tense using *aller + infinitive*: *je vais faire de l'équitation, nous allons prendre le train* (*page 28 dossier-langue*)
 - Talking about what you want to do and what you can do using **vouloir** and **pouvoir** (*pages 30 and 46*)
 - Use the perfect tense **including irregular past participles** (*dossier-langue pages 60, 63, 64, 65, 74, 90, 93*)
 - Recognise reflexive verbs in the past tense**
 - Use expressions of time with the past, present and future (*page 67*)

As well as your text book and your Grammar in Action books, you should also revise from your exercise books and vocabulary books.

Class 2 Revision Guide for History

- The Class Two Summer Examination will be one hour in length.
- Part One is the source section. It will consist of a **compulsory set of source questions** based on unseen sources on the **SPANISH ARMADA**. It is worth 20 marks.
- Part Two is the structured paragraphs section. The questions will be from the main topics below. This section is also worth 20 marks in total. There will be a choice of main questions. Each main question will have a 4, 6 and 10 mark sub-question.
- You should aim to spend 30 minutes on each section.
- The textbook for revision is “Renaissance, Revolution and Reformation”.

Class 2 Revision Guide for Italian

You will be tested in listening, reading and writing. The listening, which you will do before half-term, will be approximately 35 minutes and the reading and writing will be 45 minutes. In the writing you will also do some grammar exercises.

Revise vocabulary for Unit 4 *Amici d'Italia*,

Topics include:

1. describing physical appearance
2. describing character
3. talking about hobbies and free time
4. school subjects
5. family members
6. pets

Grammar:

1. formation of regular verbs in the present tense
2. the irregular verbs *stare, fare*
3. verbs ending in *-care* and *-gare*
4. irregular verbs in *-ire* that take the *-isc* suffix
5. adjectives describing character & physical appearance
6. possessives (il mio, il tuo etc.)

Class 2 Revision Guide for Chinese

You will be tested in listening, speaking, reading and writing. Each will be worth 25%. For the speaking, you will use the possible questions to help you present a picture following with free interaction based on the presentation. The speaking will be 3-3.5 minutes. In the writing you will translate 2 sentences from English to Chinese characters and write an essay in Chinese characters (up to 75 characters).

Revise vocabulary for Units 1 – 6, the 'now you can...' sections (last page of each unit) will help.

Topics include:

1. Hello & Greeting
2. About yourself - age, name, nationality
3. Your family - age, name, nationality, occupation, place of residence
4. Your things
5. Shopping in China
6. Where - place & location

Class 2 Revision Guide for Mathematics

This year's Summer Examination will consist of 2 papers, of lengths 60 minutes and 30 minutes respectively (plus extra time). A calculator will be allowed for the 60-minute paper. The 30-minute paper is non-calculator.

Students will be required to bring in their own equipment for both tests. This includes a calculator, a protractor, a pair of compasses and a 30 cm ruler, as well as general writing equipment. All students will be given blank copies of the chapter tests they have been doing throughout the year for revision purposes.

Number

- Fractions – Adding, subtracting, multiplying, dividing, and converting to proper and improper fractions.
- FDP – Converting between fractions, decimals and percentages.
- Percentages – Percentage of amounts and percentage increase/decrease
- Negative numbers
- Sequences – Generating terms in a sequence and finding the n th term.
- BIDMAS – Order of operations
- Rounding to a specified number of decimal places
- Estimation
- Ratios – dividing an amount into a ratio and problems involving ratio

Algebra

- Collecting like terms
- Expanding brackets
- Simplifying algebraic expressions
- Solving equations with x on one side and both sides of an equation
- Substitution into formulas and expressions.
- Forming equations from given information

Shape and Space

- Area and Perimeter – Rectangles, triangles and compound shapes.
- Circles – Area and circumference of circles, semicircles and quarter-circles
- Volumes – Cuboids, prisms and compound shapes
- Geometrical reasoning – Angles in basic shapes, angles in parallel lines.
- Transformation of shapes – describing and performing translation, rotation, reflection and enlargement.
- Constructions - Bisecting a line, bisecting an angle
- Bearings and scale drawing of triangles.
- Pythagoras' Theorem

Handling data

- Finding the mean, mode, median and range from a small data set.
- Finding the mean, mode, median and range from a frequency table.
- Probability – Probability of an event occurring and expected number of outcomes.

Class 2 Revision Guide for Music

Everything you need to know for your examination can be found in your workbooks for this academic year!

- The questions in the **examination** will test your understanding of musical vocabulary, the musical elements, styles and historical context. For example:

Which three chords are used in the 12-bar blues? Choose from the list below:

I, II, III, IV, V, VI, VII

- For the examination, you should know these **Italian musical terms**:

Dynamics	Tempo
<i>Forte</i>	<i>Allegro</i>
<i>Mezzo forte</i>	<i>Andante</i>
<i>Piano</i>	<i>Adagio</i>

You should also learn any specific musical vocabulary related to the topics we have covered. You will find these words in your booklets, which, nearer the time, you will be able to take home to revise from. This year's topics have been:

- The Music of Africa
- Minimalism
- The Blues
- Popular Song
- Film Music

This examination will not test the 'theory of music'! You will not have to answer questions about note names but will be required to look at musical scores and find Italian terms within them.

EXAMINATION FORMAT

Examination paper:

You will complete an examination paper lasting approximately **thirty minutes**. The paper will contain a series of multiple choice questions and some short score analysis questions which are designed to assess your understanding of musical terminology, vocabulary and techniques.

Class 2 Revision Guide for Religious Studies

The examination will last 1 hour.

All questions have to be answered in *full sentences*. There will be knowledge questions, explaining questions and 'argument essays' in each section of the examination paper.

The examination will be in three sections.

- Muslim belief and practice;
- Hindu belief and practice;
- Buddhist belief and practice.

You have to answer questions on two out of the three sections.

You will be given a detailed topic list with textbook page references and sample questions.

Choose your two sections, learn the relevant technical terms and write detailed revision notes.

All the information you need should be in your exercise book.

Go back to the textbooks and use Firefly if you have missed any topics or need additional information.

Class 2 Revision Guide for Science

- Length of exam: 1.5 hours. The marks for each question are clearly shown. There are three sections covering Biology, Chemistry and Physics.
- Revision topics:

Biology: Observation in Biology; using microscopes; DNA structure; types of cell division (mitosis and meiosis); DNA in cell division; vegetative propagation; plant cloning; sexual reproduction in flowering plants; life cycles of mosses.

Chemistry: The Periodic Table; metals and non-metals; particle theory; word equations and types of reaction; properties of compounds and mixtures; separating techniques; reactions of metals with oxygen, water and acids; the reactivity series and displacement reactions; acids and alkalis; pH; chemical energy.

Physics: Energy; energy resources; light; reflection and refraction; filters and colour; the Solar System; gravity; day and night and seasons.

The textbooks for revision for Chemistry and Physics are the 'Longman Chemistry and Physics' books and for Biology it is 'Longman Biology' and 'GCSE Biology, MacKean'.

Class 2 Revision Guide for Spanish

This is not an exhaustive list and this is just to guide you through your revision more effectively. All modern languages exams require students to deal effectively with unfamiliar language, so please be prepared for some unexpected vocabulary or phrases; this is all part of the assessment.
